WHAT IS A LAND TRUST?



A land trust or a land conservancy is a nonprofit organization that works with landowners and the community to conserve land, as well as steward or take care of the conserved land forever.



Land Conservation Protects Water Quality (and possibly improves it too!)

Protects

- Conservation easements extinguish development rights
- Limit stormwater runoff
- Limits nutrient loads
- Allows land to hold water
- Prevents flooding downstream
- Prevents erosion

Improves

- Incentivizes restoration
 - Gives funders security for restoration investment
 - Many restoration grants require CE
- Many CEs require best management practices (BMPs)
- With signage and marketing, brings community awareness



Re-Wilding the Quads

- Partnered with Sarasota Audubon Society (SAS)
- County donated conservation easements to CFGC
- SAS has Management Agreement with County
- SAS and CFGC
 - Designed project
 - Fundraising
- Benefits
 - Improved water quality
 - Improved habitat
